

Ordinance 02012016B Setting Qualification Fees

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF VANCE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A qualification fee in the amount of \$50.00 is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as mayor of the Town of Vance, Alabama, except as hereinafter provided for.


Section 2. A qualification fee in the amount of \$50.00 is hereby fixed and imposed upon all candidates seeking election as councilmember of the Town of Vance, Alabama, except as hereinafter provided for.

Section 3. Such qualification fee shall be paid to the city clerk and deposited to the general fund of the city at or prior to the time of taking out qualification papers by any such candidates.

Section 4. Any person desiring to qualify who is not financially able to pay the required fee may qualify provided such prospective candidate furnishes the clerk with an affidavit stating that he is financially unable to pay the required fee fixed by this ordinance.*

Section 5. This ordinance is adopted pursuant to Section 11-46-2 of the Alabama Code of 1975 and shall be effective in all elections, both general and special, for aforesaid offices from and after the date of adoption.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF VANCE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:



Section 2. That the places on the Town Council be and the same are hereby designated as Place Number 1, Place Number 2, Place Number 3, Place Number 4 and Place Number 5.

Section 3. That each candidate for a place on the Town Council shall in the announcement of his or her candidacy designate by number the place for which he or she is a candidate and no person shall be a candidate for more than one place.

Section 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:



II. It shall further be known that at this time the Planning and Zoning is unanimous in its decision this is for the best and the zoning change is in harmony with the area.



ORDINANCE NO. 04182016

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH PARKING REGULATIONS


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF VANCE, ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

The Town Council for the Town of Vance hereby authorizes the Magistrate for the Town of Vance to impose regulations as set out below:

- I. It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic-control device, if any of the following places or portions thereof:
 - A) On a sidewalk;
 - B) In front of a public or private driveway;
 - C) Within fifteen (15) feet of an intersection;
 - D) Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant;
 - E) On a crosswalk;
 - F) Within twenty (20) feet of a crosswalk at an intersection except at intersections where traffic is controlled by a police officer or traffic-control device;
 - G) Within thirty (30) feet upon the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign or traffic-control signal located at the side of the roadway;
 - H) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within thirty (30) feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless the director of transportation indicates a different length by signs or markings;
 - I) Within fifty (50) feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;
 - J) Within twenty (20) feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within seventy-five (75) feet of such entrance (when properly posted);


- K) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
 - L) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
 - M) Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a highway or within a highway tunnel;
 - N) At any place where official signs prohibit parking or stopping or the curb is painted yellow;
 - O) On any median or other area of a street not improved as a roadway;
 - P) On the area between any roadway and the sidewalk adjacent thereto.
- II. Violation of this ordinance resulting in a conviction shall be punishable by a fine of up to Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and a jail sentence of up to thirty (30) days.

ORDINANCE NO. 12052016

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHED TO PROHIBIT AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLING WITHIN THE TOWN OF VANCE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF VANCE,
ALABAMA, AS FOLLOWS:

The Town Council for the Town of Vance hereby authorizes the Magistrate for the Town of Vance to impose regulations as set out below:

I. Intent.

It is the intent of the city council to endeavor to provide citizens with an environment free from such aggressive panhandling as may jeopardize their health, welfare and safety, or degrade their quality of life.

II. Definitions.

(a) Panhandling: Any request made in person upon any street, alley, sidewalk, municipal building, municipal right-of-way, public park, stadium or amphitheater in the corporate limits of the city for an immediate donation of money or other gratuity from another person. Panhandling shall include the sale of an item for an amount far exceeding its value, under circumstances in which a reasonable person would understand that the purchase is, in substance, a donation. Panhandling shall not include the act of passively standing or sitting, performing music, or singing with a sign or other indication that donations are being sought without any vocal request other than a response from inquiry by another person.

(b) Aggressive panhandling:

- (1) Touching without consent or blocking the path of the person approached for panhandling.
- (2) Following behind, ahead or alongside a person who walks away after giving a negative response to panhandling.
- (3) To persist in panhandling after the person approached has given a negative response.
- (4) To use profane or abusive language while panhandling or making any statement, gesture or other communication which would cause a reasonable person to be fearful while panhandling.
- (5) To engage in conduct while panhandling that would reasonably be considered as intended to intimidate, compel or force a person to make a donation.
- (6) To service a motor vehicle, including, but not limited to, any cleaning, washing, protecting, guarding or repairing of said vehicle or any portion thereof, without the

prior consent of the owner, operator or occupant of such vehicle, and thereafter requesting payment for the performance of such service, regardless of whether such vehicle is stopped, standing or parked on a public street or upon other public or private property.

III. Unlawful panhandling.

A person commits the offense of unlawful panhandling if he or she either:

- (1) Engages in any act of aggressive panhandling as defined herein; or,
- (2) Engages in the act of panhandling on any day after sunset or before sunrise; or,
- (3) Engages in an act of panhandling in the following locations: at a bus stop; any public transportation vehicle or public transportation facility; any vehicle which is parked or stopped on a public street or alley; any sidewalk café or within twenty (20) feet in any direction from automatic teller machine or entrance to a bank.

IV. Severability.

The provisions of this article are declared to be severable. If any portion of this article shall be held unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling shall not affect the remaining portions of this article nor render the remaining portions of this article invalid.

V. Enforcement.

(a) Abatement order. Any sworn police officer of the city shall have the authority to issue a written or verbal order to any person found in violation of this article to abate the nuisance and if, after having received such order, such nuisance is not immediately abated, then the person found in violation of this article may be cited for a violation.

(b) Penalties. Any person violating any provision of this article shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both, in the discretion of the city court.


(c) Injunctive relief. In addition to any other penalties or remedies provided hereunder, the city shall have the right to proceed in the circuit court for injunctive relief for any violation of this article by filing suit therefor in the name of the city.
