A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION



Be it resolved that the Town earlier advertised bids for a sewer construction project. Upon receiving and opening the bids it was determined by the Council in a previous Resolution that all of the qualifying bids were unreasonable and that they were unacceptable to the Town. By this Resolution the Town determines that it is essential to the health, safety and welfare of the Town of Vance that the sewer construction project be immediately commenced and that the Town authorizes the Mayor to negotiate that the work shall be done by Force Account under the direction and control of the Town and its engineer. This Resolution also requires the Mayor to negotiate a price for the work under Section 39-2-1, Code of Alabama (1975) for the actual costs for labor, materials, and equipment usage incurred in the performance of the work that shall be less than the lowest unacceptable bid received when the project was originally advertised.

STATE OF ALABAMA
EXECUTIVE RESOLUTION TO BE USED WHEN APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO
THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, certain areas of The TOWN OF VANCE are subject to periodic flooding, mudslides, (i.e., mudflows), or flood-related erosion, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Council to require the recognition and evaluation of flood, mudslide (i.e. mudflow) or flood losses pursuant to §§11-19-1 to 24; 11-45-1 to 11; 11-41-9 to 166; 11-52-1 to 84, **et Seq., Code Of Alabama 1975.**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this Council for the TOWN OF VANCE:

1. Assures the Federal Insurance & Mitigation Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force those areas having flood, mudslide (i.e. mudflow), or flood-related erosion hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in CFR 44, Part 60.3 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

2. Vests The Engineer for the TOWN OF VANCE with the responsibility, authority, and means to:

(a) Assist the Administrator, at his request, in his delineation of the limits of the area having special flood, mudslide (i.e. mudflow), or flood related erosion hazards;

(b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain, mudslide, (i.e. mudflow), or flood-related erosion areas;

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map and identify floodplain, mudslide (i.e. mudflow) or flood related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain, mudslide (i.e. mudflow) and/or flood related erosion areas to prevent aggravation of existing hazards;

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of floodplain management measures; and

DESIGNATION OF THE NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (NIMS)
AS THE BASIS FOR ALL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT IN VANCE, ALABAMA.

WHEREAS, the President in Homeland Security Directive (HSPD)-5, directed the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security to develop and administer a National Incident Management Systems (NIMS), which would provide a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, local and tribal governments to work together more effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to and recover from domestic incidents, regardless of cause, size or complexity;

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Alabama in Executive Order Number 24 has established the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the State standard for incident management and directed the Alabama Emergency Management Agency and Alabama Department of Homeland Security to begin immediately to implement NIMS.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that all Federal, State, local and tribal emergency agencies and personnel coordinate their efforts to effectively and efficiently provide the highest levels of incident management;

WHEREAS, to facilitate the most efficient and effective incident management it is critical that Federal, State, local, and tribal organizations utilize standardized terminology, standardized organizational structures, interoperable communications, consolidated action plans, unified command structures, uniform personnel qualification standards, uniform standards for planning, training, and exercising, comprehensive resource management, and designated incident facilities during emergencies or disasters;


WHEREAS, the NIMS standardized procedures for managing personnel, communications, facilities and resources will improve the Town's ability to utilize federal funding to enhance local agency readiness, maintain first responder safety, and streamline incident management processes.


WHEREAS, the Incident Command System components of NIMS are already an integral part of various incident management activities throughout the Town, including current emergency management training programs; and

WIIEREAS, the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks (9-11 Commission) recommended adoption of a standardized Incident Command System;


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Vance adopts the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the standard for incident management in Vance, Alabama.



RESOLUTION 071006A

WHEREAS, the Alabama Community Development Block Grant Program has been established to assist local government in meeting community development and housing needs consistent with the objectives as set forth in Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Vance has determined their desire to develop and submit a Community Development Block Grant to benefit predominately low and moderate income persons; and

THEREFORE, in accordance with CDBG regulations Vance is required to adopt a Citizen Participation Plan that provides all citizens of Vance with an adequate assessment of the city's action plan programs. The plan shall set forth policies and procedures for citizen participation in Vance's development process. Special emphasis will be placed on encouraging participation by persons of low and moderate incomes, residents of blighted neighborhoods, and residents of areas where community development funds are utilized.


NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that Vance has developed the Citizen Participation Plan; and
